What to Bring:

1. Backpack—You need to either have an external frame backpack to hold all of your items or an internal frame pack that has no less than 3,500 square inches of storage!
2. Clothes—swimming gear, warm clothes, cap, shorts, pants, and work gloves.
3. Sleeping Bag & Pillow
4. Toiletries—Deodorant, soap, toothpaste, bug repellent, toilet paper, & sunscreen.
5. Tent—Find a buddy to share the load by splitting up the tent pieces in each other's pack. This will really lighten your load! This is your own responsibility!
6. Tools & Utensils—Fork, spoon, knife, small bowl, water bottle, flashlight or headlamp, pen, paper, matches, a small stove for cooking (optional), camera (optional), duct tape, fishing tools (optional), & BIBLE (you can share with your hiking buddy).

*****Helpful Advice—Be sure to pack small amounts of things. A small BIBLE, plastic utensils, small roll of duct tape for emergency purposes, and if you want to lighten your load you can leave your pillow at home and use a sweatshirt as a pillow and extra blanket! Think practically when you pack and do a bit of homework when learning how to efficiently pack! Work with a friend to share certain objects as to help minimize pack weight. You can search websites such as www.hikingandbackpacking.com for more packing tips.

Do Not Pack: MP3 players, ipods, radios, and any gadgets that might hinder what we are trying to accomplish. Also, do not pack weapons or any sort of drugs. Medication is okay but must be checked into our hiking nurse before departure.
